The Round Dance ceremony illustrates the Cree philosophy of death and its relationship between us and Spirits. The Northern Lights are said to be our relations that have passed on. The Elders say that the people that have passed on come to dance with us at the Round Dance; in that respect our relatives are always here with us. In this dance people move like the Northern Lights, in an up and down motion as they dance around the drum.

We join hands in a circle and dance clockwise with the drum and singers sitting in the middle. The beat of the drum is like the heartbeat of the community and all members move as one. The Round Dance was a healing ceremony that became a social dance for our people and a dance that is held in the winter season. From the first tuning of the hand drums (by way of fire), to the fun of meeting old friends and making new, a Round Dance is for everyone, children, friends, families, youth and Elders. This is a time to swap stories, catch up on the latest news, break bannock, and share some tea. And even better, to hear both the old and new songs sung by your favorite singers.

It's a time to honor traditions and memories of our ancestors dancing around their starry campfires, flickering against the dark blanket of the night sky.

Legend has it that all dreams are floating through the air during the night searching for their destination. While sleeping under a Dream Catcher placed near the head, bad

dreams are confused and get caught up in the catcher's web, the Dream Catcher holds until the next day. All bad dreams perish in the morning light of the new day. But the good dreams know the way through the web and can easily slip through the center hole. They slide down the feathers, taking on good energies from them. The good dreams can enter the wise dreamer's head, bringing the absorbed energy with them.

Have you submitted your year end paperwork yet?



If your Foster Care Support Worker hasn't done so already, they will be bringing year end paperwork to you during a home visit. Documents are processed as follows:

- Two copies of the new contract will be brought out. Both foster parents must sign and date both copies of the contract. Your FCSW must also sign (witness) both copies. Foster parents retain one copy; one copy is returned to the office for data entry and is then placed on the foster parent file.
- One copy of the sub-delegation will be brought out. A second copy will be placed on the foster parent file.
- A blank copy of the Fire Drill Log will be brought out to record fire drills for 2020. Foster parents should turn in their completed 2019 Fire Drill Log at this time. The completed 2019 log is returned to the office for data entry and is then placed on the foster parent file.
- If there are children 12 or over in the foster home, your FCSW will review the Child/ Youth Orientation Handbook with them. The child will then sign & date a form indicating they have reviewed the handbook. This form will be returned to the office for data entry and then placed on the child's file.
- A new Foster Parent Emergency Contact Information form needs to be completed. It will be returned to the office for data entry, and placed on the foster parent file.
